IT HELPDESK



To avoid a long waiting time, you can check the LIVE view of the service queue at the IT Help Centre. This may be accessed online via OASIS, at the bottom of the left sidebar.

01 Software Installation & System Setups

All SMU students are entitled to download various software, including the Microsoft Suite. An exhaustive list of software and their download guides/links can be found <u>here</u>.

A) School Wifi Connection

- 1. Look for the network with the name "WLAN-SMU"
- 2. When you click into it, it will prompt you to fill in your username and password
 - Username: School Email Username (e.g. jane.doe.2024)
 - Password: Your password for your SMU email

B) SMU Account Password Management

You are required to change your password **every 180 days** or you will be locked out of your email and OASIS account. There will be several emailers reminding you to change it after finals, so do keep a lookout for it!

It is important to keep your account active as being locked out of your accounts would mean that you are not allowed to bid for modules or access your results.

In the event you do get locked out of your account, the following are **three ways** to unlock your account:

- Register for the <u>online service</u> (recommended)
- Email in to the IT Helpdesk for assistance: <u>helpdesk@smu.edu.sg</u>
- Reset password at the IT Help Centre during office hours

You can access the guide to change your SMU account password <u>here</u>. Do note that after every password change per semester, you would need to do the above steps again to reconnect to the Wi-Fi.

02 Respondus Lockdown Browser (*Exam*)

Some of the tests and exams in SMU are held online through the Respondus Lockdown Browser, which can be downloaded <u>here</u>. The Respondus Lockdown Browser Installation Guide is available <u>here</u>.

During the test or exam, you can launch the lockdown browser through "Quizzes" on the respective module page on eLearn. Do remember to bring your laptop chargers during the test or exam and keep your laptop charged throughout as you are unable to see your battery status once the browser is launched.

How to launch or check your Lockdown Browser

SMU has provided several quizzes with unlimited attempts for you to check and test out your Lockdown Browser. As there may be some system updates over time, it will be good to check before every test or exam.

1. Go onto eLearn and click on "Student Orientation to eLearn"

(Do note that module naming may differ)



2. Click on "Quizzes" and it would show you this page as shown below. There are different kinds of quizzes available for you to test.

03 Printing Services

There is a printing room located on Level 2 of every faculty building in SMU. There are printers found in both Li Ka Shing Library and Kwa Geok Choo Library as well.

* Do take note that **colour** printers are **<u>only available</u>** in the two libraries (the printers in the school buildings can only print black and white)

Internet connection is all you need! Students can print their documents anytime and anywhere by saving their work and uploading it onto the printing website linked <u>here</u>. You should see this page as shown below when you click into the link.

Payment may be made by Ez-link/Nets FlashPay or SGQR (eg: PayNow). Students can submit the document via web browsers from anywhere with an internet connection and release and collect their printouts from the location of their choice in the library and common spaces in the schools. OASIS (Online Access to Student Information System)

OASIS is an online portal that contains a non-exhaustive list of information such as regarding BOSS bidding, curriculum matters, financial assistance schemes, career development and community service matters. It is one of the most widely used platforms for all SMU students as we are able to find most of the information we need on here!

01 eLearn

A portal for you to retrieve course materials and to complete mandatory online courses in SMU. You can access e-Learn <u>here</u>.



Brightspace Pulse

In need to view your course materials on the go?

You can download "Brightspace Pulse" to easily access your eLearn on your mobile devices. Available on both the App Store/Google Play Store.

Simply search for "SMU eLearn" upon downloading the app, and it will direct you straight to the eLearn portal!

02 OnTRAC II

An online platform for students to apply for job/internship positions. It can only be accessed upon completion of the mandatory e-internship online units (refer to <u>Chapter 2</u> for more details). You can also book appointments with your career coaches (DKHMCC) through this portal.

Each student is allocated to a career coach who will send you an email. You are encouraged to make an appointment with them as they would be able to provide valuable insight as to how you should be mapping out your university journey in the next four years in SMU.

03 Facility Booking System (FBS)

An online platform, also known as FBS, for students to book facilities such as Group Study Rooms (GSRs), Seminar Rooms (SRs) and Classrooms (CRs) for project discussions. Most of the facilities will require <u>at least 1 co-booker</u> to confirm on the booking!

Every student is given **4500 credits** per academic year, and will restart at the start of each academic year (AY).

04 BOSS Bidding Portal


AFTERCLASS

An external website for course and professor reviews. This website provides students' evaluations of the course and professor, listing the pros and cons of the content taught and what the teaching style of the professor is like.

AfterClass also offers other services such as Bid Price Analytics, a platform for students to buy and sell textbooks, notes as well as student deals.

COMMUNITY SERVICE ONLINE UNITS

Before embarking on your community service efforts, you have to complete <u>four</u> mandatory online units: one Reflection Practice Unit (RPU) and three Community Service Units (CSUs) on eLearn.

The RPU will equip you with skills for deeper and more meaningful reflection, while the CSUs will introduce you to guiding principles and tools such as service learning, needs analysis and asset mapping.

It is <u>highly recommended</u> that you complete these units before the semester starts, or minimally before the start of Year 2.

GPA CALCULATION

SMU has a 4-point grading system. The following grade notations are used in calculating the Grade Point Average (GPA), which is the quotient of total grade points divided by total course units attempted:

Where computations result in the cumulative GPA exceeding the 4-point grading system, a round down approach will be adopted. The highest cumulative GPA attainable by a student is 4.00.

EXPLORATORY UNITS

In SMU, all undergraduate students are given an option to exclude two course units of **passed** grades from cGPA computation.

Under the Exploratory Courses Policy, it will only be applicable for modules taken <u>before</u> their final term of coursework (with the exception of compulsory University/Programme Core courses, compulsory Major courses and compulsory Track courses).

In other words, students may declare any two passed non-mandatory or additional courses (i.e. any electives) taken in SMU up to, and including, their penultimate term of coursework as Exploratory Courses.

For single degree students:

• Able to declare a maximum of 2 majors (First and Second Majors)

For double degree students:

- Primary degree Able to declare a maximum of 2 majors (First and Second Majors)
- Secondary degree Only 1 major (First major)

You will need to declare your second major by the <u>end of your second year</u> in SMU.

Do take note that a penalty of **e\$10** will be imposed for any drop, amendment or late declaration of Majors.

02 BOSS Bidding Crash Course



03 Career Guidebook

Under the guidance of working professionals, it aims to provide valuable insights into the diverse career pathways available to Accountancy students after graduation. It serves as a resource for both undergraduates and graduates to explore their preferred field.

These guidebooks are available for download from the <u>ASoc website</u> under 'Guidebooks'. The guidebooks are refreshed annually (before every new academic year) to provide students with the up-to-date information on all the changes in SMU and BAcc curriculum.



Every SMU student has to fulfil the global exposure requirement before they graduate. The following are some of the programmes students can participate in to meet this requirement! Modules taken abroad are on a **pass/fail basis** and are not counted towards your GPA.

ACCOUNTING/BUSINESS STUDY MISSIONS (ASM/BSM)

Study missions are study programmes that encompass a short overseas study trip. It can usually fulfil the Asia Studies and Global Exposure requirement.

Look out for emails from SoA and LKCSB regarding the study missions. It contains important information that you will need for the application process as well as available financial assistance. Do read up carefully before signing up to ensure the modules you are looking for can fulfil your degree progress requirement.

Students do not have to bid for ASM/BSM but there is an <u>automatic **e\$20** deduction</u> upon your acceptance of the offer.

Common destinations for past Accounting or Business Study Missions include South Korea, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Thailand and Taiwan.

SHORT-TERM STUDY PROGRAMME (SSP)

Look out for emailers from the Centre for Global Education and Opportunities (GEO) on the different short-term study opportunities available during Summer (Term 3A or 3B) and Winter (Modified Term 1). SSP allow students to clock 0.5 to 2 SMU Credit Units (depending on programme).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME (ISEP)

Many SMU students choose to go on exchange for a semester at one of SMU's overseas partner universities during their third or fourth year. However, students are not allowed to go on ISEP if they are in their final semester.

Look out for emailers from the Centre for Global Education and Opportunities (GEO) on the different exchange opportunities available.

Students usually choose to clear the following modules during their exchange:

- Accounting Electives
- Free Electives
- SMU Core Capabilities:
 - Managing (Elective)
 - Modes of Thinking (Elective)
- SMU Core Communities
 - Technology and Society (Elective)
 - Cultures of the Modern World (Elective)

It is important to note that you will only be able to <u>clear up to 2 Accounting Electives</u> during your exchange. Students are **not allowed** to map any Business or Accounting core modules overseas.

OVERSEAS COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT (OCSP)

OCSPs are a great way to help others while clearing the 80-hour community service requirement! SMU has numerous OCSPs for students to join, make new friends and do good deeds.

Do look out for the recruitment emails sent out by the many OCSPs that will be carried out during the winter and summer holidays. Common destinations are Southeast Asian countries like Thailand, Vietnam and Cambodia.

These trips are usually subsidised (especially if it is your first OCSP) and you can use funds from your PSEA (Post Secondary Education Account) to pay for your OCSP trip as well.



The School of Accountancy, together with the Accounting Society (ASoc), hold several initiatives in providing a fulfilling and vibrant student life through the following programmes put in place:

ASOC MENTORING SCHEME

The ASoc Mentoring Scheme (AMS) aims to help incoming freshmen transition into university life by having mentors share their experiences and provide help whenever necessary.

Freshmen will be enrolled into AMS on a sign-up basis. Do look out for the email for recruitment of mentees in your Outlook!

Each mentoring group will comprise one mentor and a few freshmen. Freshmen will be assigned to their ASoc Camp facilitators should their facilitators be mentors under this scheme.



SOA PEER TUTORING SCHEME

SoA Peer Tutors are students who are academically stronger and handpicked to assist other students academically, under the guidance of the Dean and other professors. They conduct revision workshops for key Accounting modules before the <u>**Final**</u> examinations.

Financial Accounting Bootcamp

It is usually held a week before the new term starts. The session is optional, but all freshmen are welcome and encouraged to join!

Participating in this project will contribute towards fulfilling the Community Service Requirements.



Through this job scope, student participants are expected to <u>gain pro-bono</u> <u>audit and advisory experience</u> in the charity sector.

Participating in this project will contribute towards fulfilling the Community Service Requirements.




ASoc strives to establish an integrative culture for BAcc students and promote an environment for holistic development.
